It's Membership Renewal Time; Don't Delay



The national YMCA Alumni office will mail you a membership renewal brochure and form for calendar year 2020 in early November. The \$50 fee for an individual or a couple includes both national and chapter dues.

If you joined YMCA Alumni this fall, your first year of membership is free. If you are over 90, you become a life member and no longer pay dues. When you renew, you will continue to be a member in good standing, can join activities in ours or any chapter, will receive the chapter and national newsletters, and are eligible for an Emergency Assistance grant should you need one.

Look for the membership packet in the mail. It will also be available in the Nov. issue of *The CONNECTION* you will receive in mid-November.
