But it was nice for Matt to share his story for us to really see how EAF can help for unplanned and unwanted financial troubles. There are as many stories out there from Y Alumni as well. We can all help.



MY MEDICAL EXPERIENCE

I was asked by the Grand Canyon Chapter President, Marian Bolton to share my recent medical experience. It certainly gave me some insight into where the practice of medicine may be heading.

I have been having a problem with my knees. It seems that they were in a painful "bone on bone" situation. As a result, I was sent to New Mexico Orthopaedics for an examination. The result was that I needed a total knee replacement.

The surgery was done on May 16th and everything went well. I was able to go home a day and a half later. Then the problems started!

The second day home I began having problems eating and began throwing up everything. I ended going to the hospital emergency room. It was determined that the medication I was given after surgery had created serious problems in my stomach and esophagus. I was referred to the hospital G I Department for treatment. Then another problem began!

I was told it would be three months before I could be seen! This went on through two more Emergency Room visits. I was finally seen by a CNP nurse on July 24th, over two months after the surgery! The nurse was outraged that it had taken so long for me to be seen and arranged for me to start treatment two days later

After a series of tests and consultations a plan was created for my treatment and recovery. To date the plan is working well. I will know for sure in October when I meet with the Doctor who treated me.

As for the knee, everything is going great! I was able to start playing golf three weeks ago and for the first time last week was able to walk nine holes with no pain!

I now appreciate the YMCA health insurance I kept after retirement. It seemed expensive at the time but now I am thankful that it covered my medical expenses so well.
